

- 2. You may enter Thailand on a Tourist Visa to set up your own company or alternatively you may do it remotely by using a professional in Thailand to set up the company for you. To the extent the business activities are restricted for foreigners you may opt for a 'preference structure' with a Thai partner see http://www.seasialegal.com/doing-business-in-thailand/. Once the company is incorporated, one of your employees will apply for a Work Permit on behalf of your company.
- 3. Tourist Visa/Exemption/Visa on Arrival can be converted into Non-Imm B Visa without leaving Thailand as long as there is still 15 days left on it but if you stay in Thailand on any type of Non-Imm Visa, you cannot convert it to a Non-Imm 'B' Visa and must leave Thailand to obtain it in your national/resident country or in a neighboring country (if not prohibited nationality).
- 4. Apply at the Thai Consulate in your national/resident country or in a neighboring country (if not prohibited nationality) and submit all required documents from you and from the company that will employ you.
- 5. As people misused gaining entry to Thailand for 90 days, and thereafter, failed to apply for a work permit, now the Thai Employer must pre-apply for Work Permit and within 30 days of entry Work Permit must be issued.
